2024-2025 COBA Rules and Philosophy



League Philosophy

The primary purpose of the league is to instruct, develop & prepare players for Middle School basketball. *A win-at-all-costs attitude does not fit our league*. The MAIN GOAL of the league is player development. **COBA is a developmental travel basketball league that teaches fundamentals in a competitive school-program atmosphere.**

Rules

Middle School basketball rules apply in our league for regular season games- 10-minute warm-up, 6-minute quarters, 10-minute half-time.

The Clock will run in the second half when the lead exceeds 20 points.

First Overtime is 3 minutes long. Every Overtime afterward is 1 Minute

5 timeouts per game 2-30's & 3-full.

Full-court press, zone, or man defenses are permitted in grades 5 and 6.

A 28.5 women's ball is used.

Allow at least 1 hour & 15 minutes for each game.

Players ARE allowed to play up a grade. NO PLAYING DOWN UNLESS APPROVED BY COBA.

- 3rd Grade Division: An athlete must be in the third grade as of October 1, 2024.
- 4th Grade Division: An athlete must be in the fourth grade as of October 1, 2024.
- 5th Grade Division: An athlete must be in the fifth grade as of October 1, 2024.

6th GradeDivision: An athlete must be in the sixth grade as of October 1, 2024.

Playing Time- The league strongly recommends that all players play 50% of each game for all players to gain valuable game experience.

No Team may press or trap with a 15 pt. lead. The violating team will receive a technical assessed to the coach.

3rd and 4th Grade-

The free-throw line is reduced to 12 feet and student athletes and may jump on the free throw.

Half Court Man to Man defense only. No Zone or trapping defense of any kind! Full-court man-to-man defense will be allowed in the last 2 minutes of the game, both Boys and Girls. 3rd and 4th Boys may press the full game after January 6th. Teams that violate this rule prior to January 6th will be assessed a technical to the coach.



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Combined and School Team Divisions

3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th-grade Girls and Boys School Teams will have 3 Divisions, 1, 2, 3. Division 1 is the most competitive, and Division 3 is the least competitive. If numbers do not permit 3 divisions in each grade, Division 3 will move up to Division 2.

Combined Division Teams are defined as combined-type teams with players from different School Districts. Any Team with all of the Players from the same School District will be considered a School Team.

Combined Team entry and placement is subject to the discretion of the League Administration and will be placed in either Elite or Division 1 for League play only. They will not participate in the school tournament and may be denied entry into the league.

**All independent/Combined Coaches must be members of AAU in good standing; clear a background check; and pass a concussion training to coach in the league. Proof of membership must be presented at the coach's meeting. Free course @ http://nfhslearn.com/courses/61037/concussion-in-sports

School or Community Program Admins will assign the Division for their Teams at time of Registration. Each team will have a first and second choice of division. TEAMS ARE NOT GUARANTEED THEIR FIRST CHOICE. It is at the discretion of COBA to determine correct division for each team.

Participating Team and Program Responsibilities

*All Registered Member Teams must have available home game gym time for the 2024-25 season.

All Teams and Programs must have verifiable insurance.

For those who need it, insurance is available by joining AAU (aausports.org) through our AAU Club. Club Name COBA, Club Code W34C9A. You must choose the added benefit option when joining to be covered. All players and coaches on the team must join to be covered.

<u>Officials</u>- the "home team" is responsible for scheduling and cost of **two OHSAA** Licensed Officials for each of their home games.
